

The Peetz High School is in the process of implementing a random drug testing policy for our high school students who wish to participate in extracurricular activities. This policy reflects the commitment of the administration, board of education, and the community to establish a drug and alcohol free school environment. This policy is for any students participating in one or more extra-curricular/co-curricular activities grades 9-12 only, and will be in effect for the beginning of the 2019-20 school year.

PURPOSES OF THIS POLICY:

1. To provide a healthy and safe environment for all students.
2. To encourage our students to make healthy choices in regards to drugs and alcohol.
3. To provide students with the opportunity to be positive role models in our school and community.
4. To identify and recommend solutions for the student who may be dependent on illegal substances.

All students who wish to participate in extracurricular activities will be asked to fill out form JJJA-E-1 and then placed in the pool. Each month 3-4 persons will be selected for random testing. Test will look for opioids, methamphetamine, cocaine, THC, and PCP.

The student and his/her parent(s) or guardian acknowledge that the Plateau RE-5 School District has the right to perform random drug and alcohol testing on students who wish to exercise the privilege of participating in athletic/extracurricular activities.

The student and his her parent(s) or guardian understand that as a condition of the student being allowed to participate in extracurricular activities in the District, the student may be required to undergo and successfully pass random screening for alcohol, illegal drugs or other banned substances, as set forth in the District's Drug Testing Policy for Students Involved in Athletics and Extracurricular Activities at Peetz SR High School (grades 9-12). The student and his/her parent(s) or guardian acknowledges that they have read and understand this policy and that they agree to all terms and conditions contained in the policy and procedure.

The student and his/her parent(s) or guardian hereby consents to participate in the Random Drug and Alcohol Testing Program and to the disclosure of testing results to the District's Drug Program Coordinator and parent(s) and guardians. The student and his/her parent(s) or guardian further understand that the student's refusal to submit to a drug screening will be treated in the same manner as if the student had tested positive for banned substances.

The student and his/her parent(s) or guardian may voluntarily consent to participate in the random drug and alcohol testing program and to the disclosure of testing results to the District's Drug Program Coordinator and parent(s) or guardian.

No student shall be penalized academically for testing positive for banned substances during random drug testing. The privilege of being allowed to participate in athletics/extracurricular activities in the Plateau RE-5 School District is contingent on the signing of this consent form.

This consent form shall remain in effect for the entire school year. Any revocation of this consent form shall disqualify the student from participating in athletics/extracurricular activities for the remainder of the school year.

Random Drug Testing JJJA

(For Students Involved in Extracurricular Activities at Peetz High School grades 9-12)

This policy is an extension of the Drug and Alcohol Use by Students JICH of the Plateau RE-5 School District. The purpose of this policy is to create a safe drug/alcohol free school for all students. It is the belief of the Plateau School District that participation on any interscholastic athletic team and in extracurricular activities is a privilege, not a right. Students who volunteer to participate in these programs are expected to accept the responsibilities granted to them by this privilege. These students as well as their parents/guardians must also recognize that because of their choice to participate in these activities, they have less expectation of privacy than do other students.

The effects of drug usage, in particular, in an educational environment are visited not just upon the users, but also upon the entire student body and faculty, because the educational process may be disrupted and the individual's safety risk factor is increased.

As this is a non-curricular occurrence, no recording of participation or of any test results, either positive or negative, will appear on the student's permanent transcript or any other permanent record.

With the legalization of recreational marijuana in Colorado for individuals over the age of twenty one, there exist several over-the-counter products that contain THC and are packaged in such a way as to hide their true purpose. Also Included in this policy are performance enhancing substances that are designed to give an athlete a competitive advantage or other chemical substances not taken in accordance with the Board policy JICH. The Plateau RE-5 School District wants to be clear in conveying the thought that the use of these products or any other illegal substances by our students is not endorsed or condoned. It is our hope that parents/guardians will support our view that the use of such substances should be prohibited.

If a student fails a random test they will not be eligible for extracurricular activities until a school approved remediation plan has been developed and completed. This plan will include strategies for making healthy choices and three substance free tests in period of 60 days. If a student fails a second test in a school year they will be ineligible for a calendar year from the time of the failed test.

Request for Retest

Students involved in the program may, upon a non-negative test result, request that the sample be re-tested (within 48 hours of being notified of the final testing result) at a second nationally certified laboratory from a list provided by A&D Compliance. The request for the test must be submitted in writing to A&D Compliance. Students participating in athletic/extracurricular activities are required to pay the associated costs for an additional test in advance. However, the costs will be reimbursed if the result of the re-test is negative.

As a means of conveying our opinions on the topic, our coaches, teaching staff, and administrators through curriculum, annual team orientations, will continue to help our students make healthy choices.
